

Information About College Crusade Scholarships

At the time of a request for a scholarship, the Crusader must be income-eligible as determined by The College Crusade for each individual class of Crusaders. Scholarships are only available for full-time degree- or certificate-seeking students. The College Crusade provides "cash" and "donated" scholarships. **Cash scholarships can be used in Rhode Island at any accredited college, community college or trade school.** They can also be used for union apprenticeship and industry training programs in Rhode Island. **Donated scholarships can be used at many Rhode Island schools and some out-of-state schools** (members of the Crusade's Scholarship Collaborative) that have agreed to provide scholarships for Crusaders.

Cash Scholarship to a School, College or University

An undergraduate scholarship from The College Crusade for:

- A maximum of two years at a Rhode Island trade, technical or proprietary school.
- Two (2) years at the Community College of Rhode Island (CCRI) or other two-year schools approved by The College Crusade.
- Four (4) years at Rhode Island College (RIC), the University of Rhode Island (URI) or other four-year schools approved by The College Crusade.

Cash Scholarship to an Industry Training Program or Union Apprenticeship Program

- A scholarship (or equivalent fee) from The College Crusade for a maximum of two (2) years to any industry training program or union apprenticeship program approved by The College Crusade.

Donated Scholarship to a School, College or University

- A scholarship from a trade, technical or proprietary school for the length of time it takes to complete its program as a full-time student, up to a maximum of two (2) years.
- A scholarship from a college or undergraduate university for a maximum of four (4) years.

Funds for donated scholarships are given by schools, colleges and universities participating in The College Crusade's *Scholarship Collaborative*, which includes Rhode Island College, the University of Rhode Island, many private colleges and trade schools in Rhode Island, and some out-of-state private institutions as well. Some schools provide additional "grant" money, while others rename part of their aid package a "Crusader Scholarship." College Crusade Scholarship Amounts

The College Crusade Scholarship will vary depending on family income, individual school costs and the financial aid policies of the school attended. The maximum amount of this scholarship will be determined by The College Crusade each year, but it will never be more than the amount of CCRI's tuition for Crusaders attending CCRI; RIC's tuition for Crusaders attending RIC; and URI's tuition for Crusaders attending URI or another approved 4-year school.
